## **Take Your Treasured Items to the OCHT Family Treasures Road Show**

Do you have heirlooms that you are interested in learning how to preserve and provide the proper care for? The Oklahoma Cultural Heritage Trust presents the Preserving Family Treasures Road Show event Sunday, April 28 from 1 to 5 p.m. at the Oklahoma History Center, 800 Nazih Zuhdi Drive in Oklahoma City.

Collections care professionals from around the nation will be on-hand to evaluate and discuss your heirlooms and items from 1 to 3 p.m. The professionals will offer tips and tactics to help preserve your treasured items. Staff from the Oklahoma History Center will be available to answer questions about the possible historical significance of items. From 3 to 5 p.m. collections care professionals will host an "Ask the Experts" forum to highlight several items brought by participants and evaluate specific methods for preservation and care. This session will also provide time for questions and answers with the professionals.

You may bring one item each from your home to be evaluated. Eight categories of items will be evaluated including paper such as letters, comic books, certificates and maps, photographs; recordings such as home movies, cassette or VHS tapes; all types of artwork, ceramics and glass, metals; textiles such as quilts, flags and clothing; and organics such as leather, baskets and feathers. Furniture, taxidermy or weapons such as swords, guns or knives are not allowed. Appraisal services will not be provided.
